Classroom Info:

Reading

We spent time reviewing the concepts we have covered since September. This includes all of our "reading tricks", monitoring our reading, accuracy/fluency/comprehension and retelling with BME...what hard workers! We will continue to add to our "toolboxes" with recognizing and appropriate use of transition words.

Writing

We used the beginning of 2016 to help us make resolutions for the year. We discussed what resolutions are and what kinds of resolutions would be appropriate for first grade. Students also have been practicing writing stories with a clear beginning, middle and end to prepare for the practice Grosse Pointe Writing which will be given next week. This is just to get students familiar with the format of this writing assessment when it is given in the spring.

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Math:

We have continued working on addition and subtraction problems and strategies to increase factual recall. We also spent time on temperature and reading a thermometer including using the unit.
