### Writing:


- Handwriting: Practice writing the words November and December (one time). Write the capital "L" and lowercase "I", number "12" and "twelve" (as many times as you can neatly).








Knowing about turn-around facts cuts down on the number of facts that have to be memorized: If you know a fact, you also know its turn-around fact.


