## Reading:

- **Reading Skills:** Talk about the books you read at home. Are they fiction or non-fiction? Ask the 5 W's questions: WHO, WHAT, WHERE, WHEN, WHY?
  - When reading at home please be on a "word hunt" and your child can find compound words, contractions, synonyms/antonyms, ing, s, ed suffixes, (kick out "Y" add ies & ed endings).



**Writing:** Enjoy the end of the year fun writing activity! Writing in a journal or diary over the summer is a great way to keep your child engaged in the writing process. Writing thank you notes, grocery lists, places to visit over the summer; emailing or handwriting letters to family members about their summer vacation are also other fabulous ways to keep up your child's writing skills!

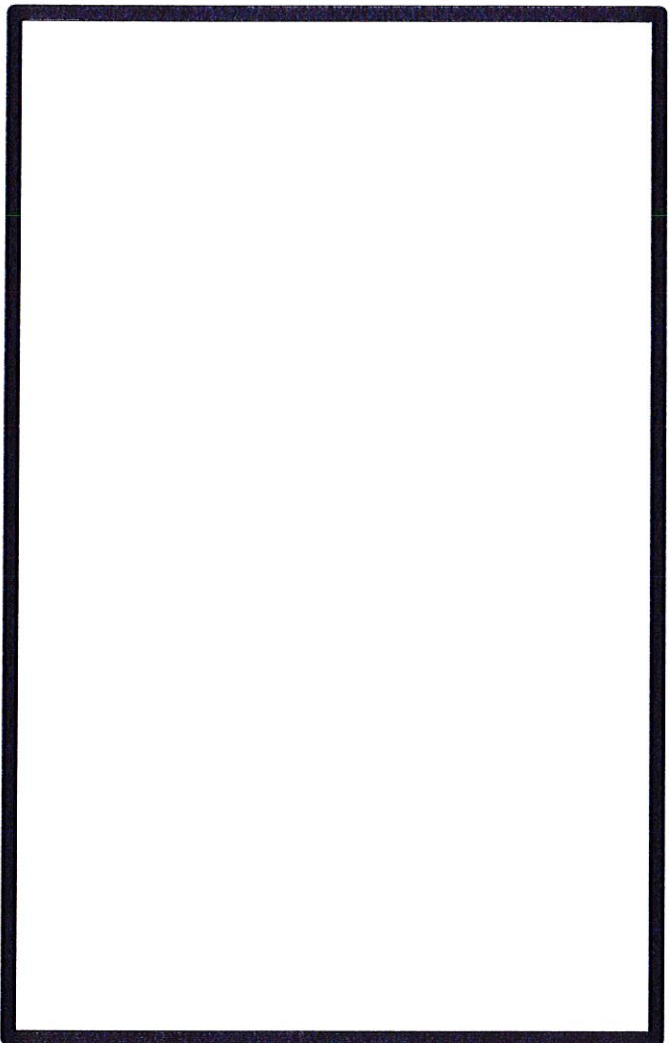

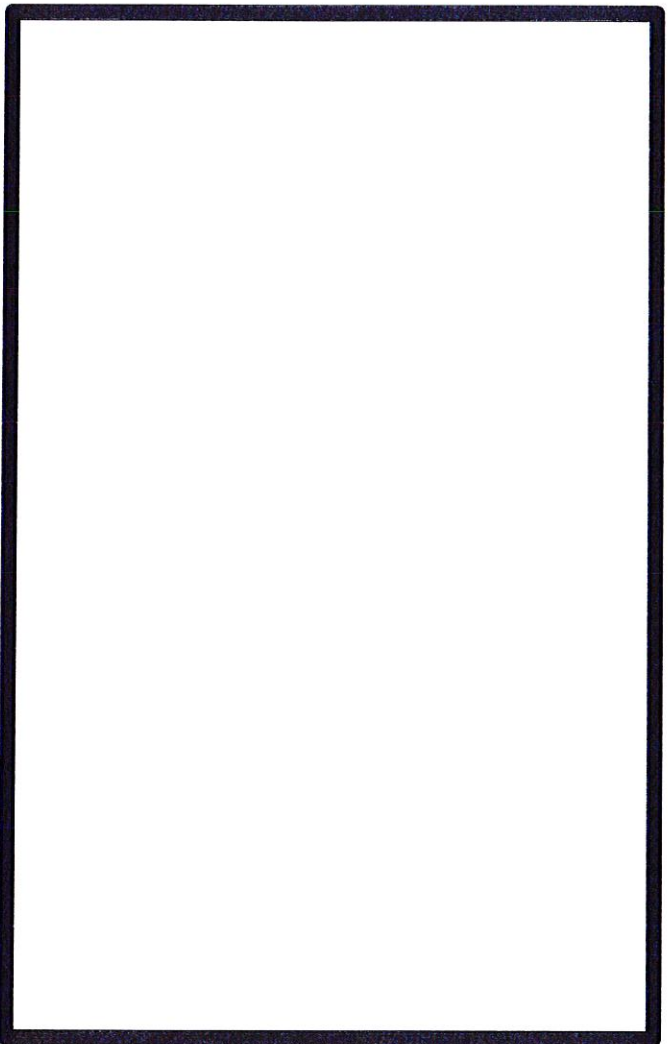

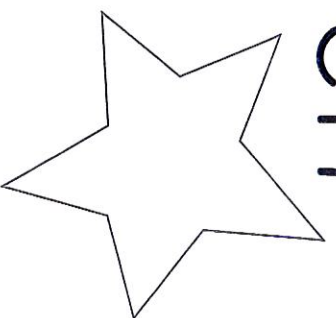
